

## STREET LEGAL

### MOTORCYCLE

Class M Driver's License	<b>REQUIRED</b>
Registration	<b>REQUIRED</b>
Eye Protection	<b>REQUIRED</b>
Insurance	<b>REQUIRED</b>
Helmet -17 and Younger	<b>REQUIRED</b>



“Motorcycle” means every motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground, but excluding a tractor.

## NOT STREET LEGAL

### POCKET BIKE

- Headlights lower than the minimum height of 24 inches.
- Tail lamps lower than the minimum height of 15 inches.
- No VIN located on the vehicle and can not be registered.



## STREET LEGAL

### MOTORIZED BICYCLE / MOPED

Class M Driver's License	<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>
Driver's License*	<b>REQUIRED</b>
Registration	<b>REQUIRED</b>
Eye Protection	<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>
Insurance	<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>
Helmet -17 and younger	<b>REQUIRED</b>



"Motorized bicycle" means every device having two tandem wheels or three wheels, which may be propelled by either human power, helper motor, or by both and which has:

- A motor which produces not more than 3.5 brake horsepower;
- A cylinder capacity of not more than 130 cubic centimeters;
- An automatic transmission; and
- The capability of a maximum design speed of no more than 30 miles per hour except a low power cycle.

\*The operator must possess a valid driver's license for any class of motor vehicle, or a driver's license specifically for the operation of a motorized bicycle per KSA 8-235.

## LIMITED STREET USE

### ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE (ATV)

<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>	Registration
<b>REQUIRED</b>	Driver's License
<b>NOT REQUIRED OFF-ROAD</b>	
<b>REQUIRED AT NIGHT</b>	Lights
<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>	Insurance
<b>CITY MAY REQUIRE</b>	



"All-terrain vehicle" means any motorized nonhighway vehicle with the following:

- 48 inches or less in width.
- Dry weight of 1,000 pounds or less.
- Travels on three or more low-pressure tires.\*
- Seat designed to be straddled by the operator.

\*"Low-pressure tire" means any pneumatic tire six inches or more in width designed for use on wheels with rim diameter of 12 inches or less and utilizing an operating pressure of 10 pounds per square inch or less as recommended by the vehicle's manufacturer.

#### MAY BE DRIVEN

- May be driven on county / township roads and within the city limits, if allowed by the city.
- The county, KDOT, or persons contracting with the government to eradicate weeds may operate an ATV along the rights-of-way of federal and state highways and incidentally operate upon such highways.

#### MAY NOT BE DRIVEN

- On any federal or state highways,
- On any interstate highway.

## LIMITED STREET USE

### MICRO UTILITY TRUCK

<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>	Registration
<b>REQUIRED</b>	Driver's License
<b>NOT REQUIRED OFF-ROAD</b>	
<b>NOT REQUIRED</b>	Insurance
<b>CITY MAY REQUIRE</b>	



"Micro utility truck" means any motor vehicle which is:

- Not less than 48 inches in width.
- Maximum length of 144 inches, including the bumper.
- More than 1,500 pounds unladen weight, including fuel and fluids.
- Can exceed 40 miles per hour as originally manufactured.
- Manufactured with a metal cab.

#### MAY BE DRIVEN

- May be driven on county black-top and gravel roads.
- CHECK WITH YOUR CITY. City ordinance might authorize the use of micro utility trucks on public highways, streets, roads, and alleys within the city limits.
- Equipment must comply with the requirements of Article 17 of Chapter 8 if operated on public roads.

#### MAY NOT BE DRIVEN

- On any federal or state highways, except to cross the highway.
- On any interstate highway.
